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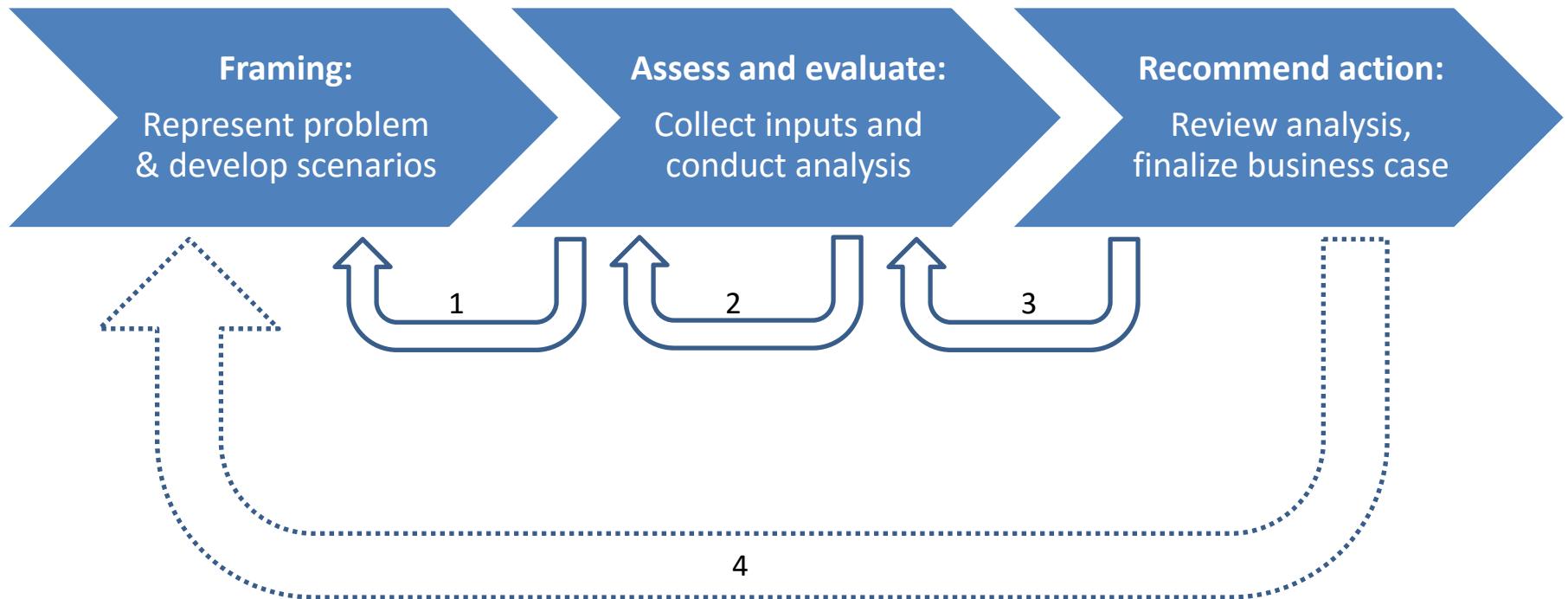
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The Ideal: Requisite Decision Models

- A model is a representation of something...
- A model is *requisite* if its form and content are sufficient to solve the problem
- *The model can be considered requisite only when no new intuitions emerge about the problem*
